

The Story So Far...

Over the last few years, residents, the Friends of Streatham Common, SCCoop and others have campaigned to get long overdue investment into Streatham Common. The Friends of Streatham Common have held public meetings to find out what's needed and paid for LUC to draw up draft plans to provide better facilities for both young and older children, within the existing playground and sympathetic to the area. The scheme also restores the lost changing rooms, and includes a new community meeting room and café with a terrace overlooking the playground.

Next Steps...

Although Lambeth Council will be paying for the new playground and facilities there must be evidence of community consultation and support for the plans. To get this evidence, the Friends of Streatham Common have organised and paid for this consultation. **It's now up to you to lend your support to the plan by completing and returning this questionnaire** to show Lambeth that there is support for the plans, including a café that will provide the revenue necessary to maintain the playground and buildings.

The **Friends of Streatham Common (FoSC)** is a voluntary organisation, run by local residents, who work to ensure that Streatham Common and the Rookery are well kept and have facilities for all sections of our community, providing community views of the maintenance and development of the area in a way that balances the needs of diverse groups of users. Lambeth's 'Cooperative Parks Programme' consultation in 2013 found the strongest response was for a complete refurbishment of the childrens' playground at Streatham Common, for better toilet facilities and a changing room development to support sports provision. Lambeth Council have now set money aside for this, but in order for them to proceed there must be another consultation and evidence of community support. 
